A MESSAGE FROM PRINCIPAL TIM

Dear King Open Families,

One of the remarkable collaborations we have at King Open is with our Extended-Day Program. Over 20% of our students also participate in Extended Day, and the Mentors from Extended Day begin their workday while school is still in session. They plan together with teachers so that mentors may learn more about children's experience in the school day and how to support children with their learning and homework in Extended Day. These mentors have developed meaningful relationships with children and families and help those of us in the school understand our students better. This year our Family Involvement Committee, including Lena and Neusa, our Family Liaisons, will be working closely with Carmen Cohen, Assistant Director of Extended Day, to plan together some of our Special Evenings at school to support wider participation of families. If you are interested in helping with these events, please contact Lena or Neusa.

We had a productive King Open School Council meeting this Wednesday evening. It was well attended and had as its focus how we keep building a welcoming, inclusive community for School Council meetings and for our whole school. We also shared some of the Staff work to help support students stay in their classes, engaged in instruction consistently, and how teachers and administrators can keep better track of our progress in improving this success for all students. CAMBRIDGE FLU CLINICS FOR FAMILIES

The Cambridge Public Health Department will be operating family friendly flu clinics on October 17th (Tobin School) and November 7th (King Open School) from 10 a.m. to 12 noon. These clinics offer free seasonal flu vaccine to Cambridge residents age 24 months and older, and will have clinic areas specially dedicated to families, in addition to "adult express" areas. Regular flu clinics are offered throughout the city starting October 8, and will offer vaccine to individuals age 3 years and older.

Remember, the 4 ways to prevent flu are: get flu vaccine, cover coughs and sneezes, wash hands frequently, and stay home when sick.
